Dr. Carmen Alvarez-Lorenzo to be inducted into medical and biological engineering elite

WASHINGTON, D.C.— The American Institute for Medical and Biological Engineering (AIMBE) has announced the election of Carmen Alvarez-Lorenzo, Ph.D., Professor, School of Pharmacy, Dept. Pharmacology, Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Technology, University of Santiago de Compostela to its College of Fellows. Dr. Alvarez-Lorenzo was nominated, reviewed, and elected by peers and members of the College of Fellows for outstanding contributions to the field of bioinspired drug delivery systems, particularly stimuli-responsive networks with molecular recognition abilities.

The College of Fellows is comprised of the top two percent of medical and biological engineers in the country. The most accomplished and distinguished engineering and medical school chairs, research directors, professors, innovators, and successful entrepreneurs comprise the College of Fellows.
